FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

It is with great pleasure that I provide you with updates on what's been happening around Tomakin.

Of significant note, is the installation of history signs at Melville Point, Jack Buckley Memorial Park (JBP) and Tomakin Beach main entrance. The signs were officially unveiled by the Hon Andrew Constance MP, Member for Bega, and Liz Innes, Mayor of the Eurobodalla Shire Council in March.



TCA has received wonderful feedback on the content of these signs. School groups have also been seen viewing the signs! The signs signal the finish of an extraordinary research and documentation project, including the book 'Tomakin - The Undiscovered History', of which over 600 copies have been sold. TCA is investigating the possibility of publishing a digital copy of the book on our website.

Another fantastic project for TCA was the 2018 Tomakin Calendar. More than 200 photos were sent in by the community, and 22 businesses agreed to have their logo included in the calendar for a small fee. Over 400 copies of the calendar were sold. TCA plan to publish the next calendar in 2020.

In partnership with Council, TCA funded a shelter over a picnic setting at the main entrance to Tomakin Beach.



Most of you would have already seen the start of a major change to the intersection of George Bass Drive and Tomakin Road. Council held a meeting in the Tomakin Community Hall in May, where residents were informed of the changes, were able to ask questions, and provide feedback. TCA will continue to work with Council on this important upgrade as required.

TCA Committee members meet with Council senior management in April 2018. This is an annual meeting and has become a great way to ensure issues identified by TCA and the community continue to be raised, and progressed as agreed, in partnership with Council.

Current priority projects for consideration include new facilities and upgrades to JBP and dredging of the Tomaga River entrance to facilitate on-going recreational boating access.

Council have subsequently requested TCA provide feedback from the community on what additional facilities should be considered for JBP. This newsletter contains a survey for the community to help TCA gather this information and we will also be garnering views at our "meet and Greet" in July. I urge you complete this survey to ensure TCA is able to give Council an accurate representation of preferred options.


TCA will also be supporting Council in their bid to have NSW funding for dredging of the Tomago River and will be sending letters to the relevant State politicians.

Jack Buckley Park - Future Development Options

Tomakin Community Association (TCA) has been looking at ways to upgrade the facilities and usage of Jack Buckley Park for some years, including discussions with council and identifying potential access to State or Federal Grant funding.

As Council have recently upgraded Jack Buckley Park from a Local Recreation Park to a District Recreation Park, TCA believe that this might be the time for this upgrade to become a reality. Council have advised that any development (other than TCA spending on the Park) would be at least 18 months away. In order to plan and prepare, they have asked TCA to consult with the community on their thoughts and ideas for the future of the Park.

TCA wants Tomakin residents to have their say on how they would like to see any available funding used in the park, so the design of the facilities can reflect what the community wants and needs. Council are keen to see community consultation undertaken prior to any decisions being taken.

The sort of facilities that TCA have been discussing include (but are not limited to) extra seating, outdoor fitness equipment, upgrades to the children's play area, a cricket pitch and fishing platforms. TCA recently used some of our funds to provide an extra picnic table however we would like to see much more happen in this space.
