The TCA would like to thank both Bendigo bank and the Stills for this marvellous and very useful donation which will allow us to commence development of this project very rapidly.



STOP PRESS

TCA has just received advice from council that they will not support (read allow!) TCA installing a fixed access structure to Tomakin Cove as they do not believe it is sustainable and may be affected during storm events. TCA strongly disagrees with this decision and believe that this claim is contrary to advice previously given to us. We will be meeting to discuss options and would ask for your support and suggestions on what we do next.

Neville's Fishing Report

Well, so much for the past 3 months' cold mornings, rough seas and generally poor weather. Even so there are a few dedicated soles that have braved conditions to bring home a feed of fish. Generally the fishing outside or seaward has not been all that exciting until the past month when, for some reason, Flathead began to appear on the old sandy areas. They are in fairly close, about 20 - 35 meters off most of the known beaches and, I may add, some excellent specimens were boated.

No reports on the old stand-by Morwong, but there have been some good reports of top snapper being taken in and around the headlands. Kingfish have long since departed the scene and bait fish appear to be absent, but this again may be a current problem.

Water temperature seems to be holding around the 19° - 20°, which is a plus. Sharks are plentiful - Gummies, School and other species on floater baits. Most of the estuaries, rivers and lakes have been producing some great winter bream with the odd Dusky Flathead putting in an appearance. Fillets of pilchard seem to be working along with the old standby Nippers when available.

I have been informed that the South Coast Mighty Bonanza Fishing Competition will possibly be the largest yet as the Tomakin Fishing Club is now affiliated with most of the major fishing sporting bodies in NSW. There are also a number of major sponsors coming on-board and cash, trophies and prizes will exceed \$80,000. This will bring this competition into focus as one of the largest competitions in NSW. Accommodation will be one

Having been away for a month or two due to an operation, it is great to be back in the old town.

Tomakin Flood Study Adopted

The Tomakin, Mossy Point, Broulee and Mogo Flood Study presented to the last general meeting of the Tomakin Community Association was adopted by Council on 28 March 2017. The study includes the catchments of Tomaga River and Candlagan Creek.

The study provides information on flood behaviour including flood levels, potential hazards and projected impacts from climate change.

The flood study will be applied to guide strategic planning, private development and public infrastructure to ensure it can be built to resist damages from flooding. For private development in Tomakin, where there is limited areas of fast flowing flood waters, this will be achieved by simply raising floor levels on new developments.
