
TCA secures \$3,000 grant

Neville's Fishing Report

Christmas has come and passed and, although the weather has left a lot to be desired, some excellent catches have been recorded in and around our area.

When one could make it seaward, Snapper and Flathead have been the mainstay of all the catches. Snapper seem to be on the bite close inshore around headlands.

Unfortunately, the lack of recent rains have had an effect on all fishing, as the blue water species rely heavily on the river runoff to bring about the necessary food chain to supply what the predators rely on.

Good rains were experienced late November and early December, but we have had no follow-up rain to keep the predators interested.

There seems to be a shortage of bait fish, like Mackerel and Pilchard. Even so, patience and constant fishing has seen some results. Right at the moment, Garfish are well established in the river and estuary systems. Shallow fishing with a tiny float and small prawn bait are showing good results, along with common bread dough. Just a tip when fishing for these delightful little critters: a burley of a small amount of dry bread crumbs mixed with a good serving of finely broken Arnott's Arrowroot biscuits will keep them around for an hour or two, coming up to high tide. No wind is essential and you can forget them after tide turn.

Bream are a little shy, but with patience on the rising tide, will answer to stripy tuna used as bait and burly. The usual nippers are still good value and have recorded some fair catches.

Yes, the old Dusky Flathead are on the prowl and, as usual, are drifting on the run-out tide for the last 2 to 3 hours. These have given some good catches in the Clyde, Moruya and Tomago rivers.

So until next report, keep those rods held high and those lines tight.

One final word, I would like to thank all those wonderful people for their tributes, messages of condolence to me and the family upon the passing of my wife Irene in October - a tragic loss to us all, remembering her dedication to the Tomakin Club and the local community over the past 38 years.
